INTRODUCTION TO REVELATION

Summary - The Book of Revelation (10 minutes)

As we begin this study of Revelation, you have nothing to fear about this study, but you have a great opportunity to grow in your faith in Jesus, and in your hope of his Second Coming!

The book of Revelation is a great book to study because Revelation is actually the only book of the Bible that comes with a promise for those who read and study it – you will be blessed (see Revelation 1:3; 22:7).

Discussion Questions - After discussing what you learned from the teaching, use the following questions to have further conversation.

- 1. As we begin our study of Revelation, have you ever read or studied the book before? What are your impressions and thoughts regarding this book?
- 2. Pastor Drew talked about two ways you would be blessed by studying Revelation. What other blessings are you hoping for over the next eight sessions?

THE VISION OF JESUS

Summary - Revelation Chapter 1 (24 minutes)

The book of Revelation is a "revelation" (singular) and it's "the revelation from Jesus Christ." The term revelation literally means an "unveiling" meaning something is being told to us we wouldn't know otherwise (Revelation 1:1-3).

It was written by the Apostle John while he was exiled to the island of Patmos probably around 90 A.D.

In Revelation 1:9-16 John had a glorious vision of Jesus. His appearance is described as:

- "Dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest..."—symbolizes how Jesus is our High Priest.
- "The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow..."—symbolizes Jesus' wisdom.
- "His eyes were like blazing fire..."—Jesus sees everything and is coming in judgment.
- "His feet were like bronze glowing in a furnace..."—symbolizes Jesus' purity.
- "His voice was like the sound of rushing waters..."—Jesus is Almighty God.
- "Coming out of his mouth was a sharp, double-edged sword..."
 —He speaks the Word of God.

The outline of the book is given in Revelation 1:19.

Discussion Questions

- 1. After reading these descriptions of Jesus, what stands out to you about Him? Why does John use such symbolic language?
- 2. Pastor Drew listed 18 other descriptions of Jesus found in Revelation. Share one or two that mean the most to you and why?
- 3. How can we pray for you as we begin this study of Revelation together?
