

KEEP TALKING

In this message, Pastor Todd shared what it practically means to be rooted and established in God's love — because when we are grounded in the Father's love, it transforms the way we live. Use this guide to keep talking about Sunday's sermon!

SERMON HIGHLIGHTS

- If God is going to do more than all we could ask or imagine, then—by definition—He isn't going to do exactly what we ask or imagine.
- Sometimes the “more” God wants to do in our lives isn't bigger—it's deeper.
- Being rooted is about being in a relationship with God.
- God is a Gardener, and He wants us to grow.
- You have to be planted to get in on the promise.
- Your roots are your responsibility. You're as close to God as you want to be.
