

# KEEP TALKING

In the final message of *Who Is God?*, Pastor Ryan unpacked the name Jehovah Tsidkenu — The Lord Our Righteousness — and what it means for us today. Use this guide to keep talking about how to walk in the righteousness God has placed on us.

## SERMON HIGHLIGHTS

- “What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us.” A.W. Tozer
- God has not left us to guess about what He is really like.
- Jehovah-Tsidkenu: The Lord is our Righteousness
  - Jehovah-Tsidkenu is more than a title — it’s a declaration.
- Righteousness is not something we *achieve*; it is something we *receive*.
- Though man cannot be righteous enough for God, God can be righteous enough for man.
- When we call on Jehovah-Tsidkenu, we are:
  - Rescued from our sin
  - Robed in His righteousness
  - Reconciled to God
  - Eager to reflect His righteousness

- If the following charges were brought against you, would you be found innocent or guilty?
  - Eating the fries out of someone else’s meal
  - Taking way too long to respond to a text
  - Pretending you didn’t see someone you know in public
  - Listening to podcasts on 1.5x
  - Hitting the snooze button one too many times

## KEEP TALKING

- What has been your biggest takeaway or revelation from this series?
- Pastor Ryan said, “*What we believe determines how we behave.*” Where do you see your view of God influencing your daily decisions, emotions, or relationships right now?
- Where are you most tempted to try to earn God’s approval? What does striving typically look like in your life?
- **Read Isaiah 61:10.** What would change in your confidence or life if you truly lived like you were clothed in His righteousness? How does knowing righteousness is something you receive (not achieve) change the way you relate to God when you fail?
- Pastor Ryan said, “*If I’m satisfied to live in sin, it means I don’t understand the significance of His sacrifice.*” Where might you be leaning toward complacency? What would it look like to reflect God’s righteousness more intentionally this week?

## KEEP IT GOING
